Trophies will be awarded on the discretion of the Trophy Secretary. These must be signed for and a £50 deposit (cash/cheque) will be required on each trophy won. Cheque deposits will be banked. Deposits will be returned when the trophy is received by the Trophy Secretary, and in an acceptable condition. Should you not wish to take the trophy, the group can arrange engraving on your behalf for a fee of £25.

NOTE TO ALL SHOW ENTRANTS: THE SHOW COMMITTEE RESERVE THE RIGHT TO SPLIT OR AMALGAMATE CLASSES WHERE APPROPRIATE IF ENTRIES WARRANT.

All horses must have up to date inoculations, either the annual booster or be at least 7 days post second injection, if a course has been recommenced. Passports will be checked on collection of competitors numbers and before any horse is unloaded. Any horse not meeting this requirement will not be able to compete and will have to be removed from the venue immediately

The Organisers and Committee of the Norfolk and Suffolk Arabian Horse Group Annual Open Show accept no responsibility for loss or damage to animals or property while travelling to or from, and while competing at the show or on the showground. We strongly recommend that all horses entered are insured and that all handlers carry public liability insurance.

A hard hat of current British safety standards with the chinstrap securely fastened must be worn at all times while mounted. This includes all ridden championship classes. Hats bearing only the BSEN1384 or EN1384 will not be accepted unless they carry another standard such as PAS 015 (1998 or 2011), VG 01.040 (2014-12), ASTM F1163 (2004a or 04a onwards), SNELL E2001 or AS/NZS 3838 (2006 onwards). All hats must be British Kite marked.

OUR SHOWS ARE A VERY RELAXED AND FRIENDLY EVENT. AS SUCH, THE NORFOLK & SUFFOLK ARABIAN HORSE GROUP POLITELY REQUESTS THAT ALL BAGS AND OTHER ITEMS INTENDED TO EXCITE THE HORSE ARE LEFT BEHIND. NEITHER BAGGING NOR UNREASONABLE NOISE WILL BE TOLERATED.

No refunds of entry fees will be offered after the closing date for entries to the show unless advised to the organisers at least 5 days prior to the show and accompanied by a veterinary certificate covering the date of the show.

IN HAND CLASSES – COMMENCING 8.30AM**

All Arab Classes are conducted in accordance with the Conditions for Shows Affiliated to the Arab Horse Society 2018.

NB. Classes 1-7 are likely to run through quickly. Please be prepared.

- Class 1 – Pure-bred Mares 4 years old and over
- Class 2 – Pure-bred Geldings 4 years old and over
- Class 3 – Pure-bred Stallions 4 year old and over
- Class 4 – Pure-bred Filly Yearling
- Class 5 – Pure-bred Colt/Gelding Yearling
- Class 6 – Pure-bred Filly 2/3 year old
- Class 7 – Pure-bred Colt/Gelding 2/3 year old

Class 8 – Crabbet & Crabbet-related class

The Crabbet horse must have minimum of 75% Crabbet blood, Crabbet-related must have one Crabbet qualifying parent. The highest placed Crabbet and Crabbet-related horse in the class to receive a qualifying Crabbet rosette.

All horses must be aged four years and over

Class 14 – Amateur/Home Produced Pure bred, Anglo or Part Bred Arabs Mare, Gelding or Stallion

Championship K – Amateur Home Produced Championship – In Hand and Ridden

Class 15 – Pre Novice Pure Anglo or Part Bred Arab Mare, Gelding or Stallion

Canter only in individual show – please see rules

Class 16 – Novice Pure-bred Mare, Gelding or Stallion

Class 17 – Open Pure-bred Mare, Gelding or Stallion

Class 18 – Novice Anglo or Part-bred Mare, Gelding or Stallion

Class 19 – Open Anglo and Part-bred Arab Class 148cms and under

IN HAND CLASSES – COMMENCING 9AM

Class 23 – In Hand Novice Horse or Pony

Open to any breed, type and age, not to have won any more than two 1st prizes in any showing class before 1st January 2018.

Class 24 – In Hand Mountain & Moorland – Large & Small Breeds

Open to Mountain & Moorland breeds registered with their respective breed societies of all ages.

Class 25 – In Hand Coloured Horse or Pony

Open to any coloured horse or pony – Piebald, Skewbald, Dun, Roan, Spotted, Cremello etc. of all ages.

Class 26 – In Hand Foreign or Rare Breeds

Open to any rare or foreign breed of all ages.

Class 27 – In Hand Riding Pony or Hunter Pony Type

Open to ponies of all ages, 15hh and under.

Class 28 – In Hand Hack, Riding Horse or Hunter Type

Open to horses of all ages.

Class 29 – In Hand Cob

Open to traditional, hogged and maxi cobs of all ages.

Class 30 – In Hand Youngstock

Open to weanlings, yearlings, 2 & 3 year olds of any breed or type.

Class 31 – In Hand Veteran Horse or Pony

Open to any horse or pony 15 years and over of any breed or type.

Championship O

First and second places from classes 23-31

RIDDEN CLASSES – NOT BEFORE 1PM

All ponies and horses must be aged four years and over

Class 32 – Lead Rein/First Ridden

Open to Lead Rein ponies not exceeding 122cm and riders not to have attained their 8th birthday before 1 January 2018. First Ridden ponies not exceeding 128cm and riders not to have attained their 10th birthday before 1st January 2018.

Class 33 – Ridden Novice

Open to any breed and type, not to have won any more than two 1st prizes in any showing class before 1st January 2018.

Class 34 – Ridden Mountain & Moorland - Large & Small Breeds

Open to Mountain & Moorland breeds registered with their respective breed society.

Class 35 - Ridden Coloured Horse or Pony

Open to any coloured horse or pony – Piebald, Skewbald, Dun, Roan, Spotted, Cremello etc.

Class 36 – Ridden Foreign Breeds

Open to any rare or foreign breed

Class 37 – Ridden Riding Pony or Hunter Pony Type

Open to ponies, 15hh and under.

Class 38 – Ridden Hack, Riding Horse or Hunter Type

Class 39 – Ridden Cob

Open to traditional, hogged and maxi cobs.

Class 40 – Ridden Veteran Horse or Pony

Open to any horse or pony 15 years and over of any breed or type.

10 MINUTE BREAK TO ALLOW TIME TO DRESS

Class 41 – Ridden Concours D'Elegance

Open to any breed or type. Lead reins are permitted.

RULES AND REGULATIONS REGARDING THE SHOW AND QUALIFIERS

AHS CLASSES

Pure-bred Arab Youngstock classes (1, 2 and 3 year olds). These classes can be amalgamated or split according to age, depending on the number of entries.

Adult classes Wherever possible mares, stallions and geldings should be judged separately.

Mares – where possible, classes could be split between barren mares or broodmares (with a foal at foot or a current covering certificate). If there is a foal class, this should be judged (with the dam present) immediately after the broodmare class and preferably, immediately before any Championship in which the dam is likely to be present. The foal would accompany its mother in a Championship.

Pure-bred Ridden Classes Show organisers could have one class for stallions, mares and geldings or they could split classes by sex.

Anglo and Part-bred Arabs In Hand Classes Classes can be split by height and, in the case of youngstock, by the expected height at maturity. For example a class for 'one, two and three year olds not expected to exceed

148cm at maturity' and a separate class for 'one, two and three year olds expected to exceed 148cm at maturity.' Adult classes can also be split by height and age.

All Classes - If sufficient entries are anticipated, classes could be further split between sexes and age groups
Pre Novice Ridden Classes

Pre Novice Ridden Horses must be 4 years old and over and will be judged as a riding horse. The judge will NOT ride. A short individual show will be required. 4 year olds to wear ordinary snaffle bridle and bit. A Pre Novice horse is one that has not been placed first more than two times at an affiliated show. Horses entered in Pre Novice classes may not enter open classes at the same show. Pre Novice classes are not qualifiers for any championships.

Being placed first in a Pre Novice class does not change the Novice status of a horse. Spurs will not be worn in Novice or Pre Novice classes.

Part-bred Arab horses or ponies must have a minimum of 12.5% of Arab blood. The percentage is normally shown on the registration certificate, but should you encounter problems, please contact the office of The Arab Horse Society. Anglo Arabs carry the blood of Arab and Thoroughbred only and in any proportion.

BRITISH ARABIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS

This is a qualifying show for the British Arabian Championships to be held on 7 & 8 September 2019 at Kings Equestrian Centre, www.kingsequestrian.co.uk. All details and Qualifying Cards from The Arab Horse Society, Agriculture House, Charnham Lane, Hungerford RG17 0EY Tel 01672 555515. Please send a SAE. Cards are £15 each. Please state horse's name, age and section when applying for a card. Cheques payable to The Arab Horse Society. Gold Qualification cards will also be given to 1st and 2nd prize winners.

The British Arabian Championship has classes for both in hand and ridden pure-bred and part-bred Arabians as well as amateurs.

CRABBET IN HAND CLASSES

For all types of classes run under these rules your horse needs to be registered with The Arab Horse Society. For Crabbet classes your horse must be pure bred Arabian and have 75% or over Crabbet and/or Old English bloodlines.

For Crabbet related classes your horse must be pure bred Arabian and have one parent with 75% or over Crabbet and/or Old English bloodlines.

For Crabbet part bred and Anglo Arab classes your horse must have one parent with 75% or over Crabbet and/or Old English bloodlines.

Crabbet related, part bred and Anglo Arab classes must be run separately from Crabbet classes.

Competitors need to obtain a letter to ascertain that their Arabian has the required bloodlines to enter classes run under these rules. The Crabbet Organisation issues these letters. Please allow at least 6 weeks from ordering to the date needed. This service is free to members of The Crabbet Organisation and £10 for each letter to non-members. Please email Mandy Thomas crabbetletters@gmail.com with the full registered name of your horse, full name of sire and dam and your name, address, email address and contact details. A copy of this letter needs to be sent with your class entry or shown to the show secretary if entered on the day of the show. If you have a Heritage Certificate issued by The Crabbet Organisation a copy of this is also acceptable. If horses are eligible for special awards for Arabians of 100% Old English or Crabbet Stud Bloodlines, this will be stated in the letter.

Exhibits should enter the ring at a walk and in a manner that does not disturb the other exhibits and proceed around the ring in walk until given further instructions by the ring steward. Outside assistance and attempting to influence the behaviour of exhibits in the ring is strictly forbidden.

All horses forward MUST be shown in a natural manner. The pose must be natural, i.e. one fore leg slightly behind the other and one hind leg slightly behind the other. The head should be held with the neck showing natural arch and curve of throat line, so that the neck is not uncomfortably stretched or raised. The horse should be trained to stand sensibly in this position with expression of interest in the handler. A frozen pose is unacceptable.

Any unnatural posing, flicking with a whip or circling when being run out, will result, at the Judge's discretion, in the horse being judged as though no presentation or display had been possible and therefore penalized accordingly.

We recommend that judges of our classes penalise uncontrolled or bad behaviour by the horse as temperament and trainability is essential in a performance breed. Any horse behaving in a dangerous manner

which could threaten the safety of other competitors or spectators may be asked to leave the ring at the judge's discretion. Horses asked to leave the ring will be disqualified.

Whips must be no more than the length of a cane i.e. 65 cm. Halters can be traditional or modern as long as they are comfortable for the horse.

Handlers dress must be neat and tidy, traditional or modern showing clothing is acceptable.

THE UK ARABIAN IN HAND AWARDS

At this show, points can be gained for the UK In Hand Awards. Cards must be signed by the judge.

A points-earning, year-long competition for members who wish to show in non-ECAHO classes and to encourage them to undertake more shows with their registered horses, in order to:

1. Encourage more people into the breed through exposure to the breed at shows where there may not be a natural interest in Pure/PB/Anglo/High Percentage Arabian horses.
2. To offer recognition to those who show their horses to a wide audience and achieve good results therefore acting as good ambassadors for the breed.
3. Encourage new owners to get involved in showing.
4. Offer a competition to the newly created High Percentage Part Bred category.

The UK Arabian In Hand Awards are presented in the main ring at the British National Championships each summer.
